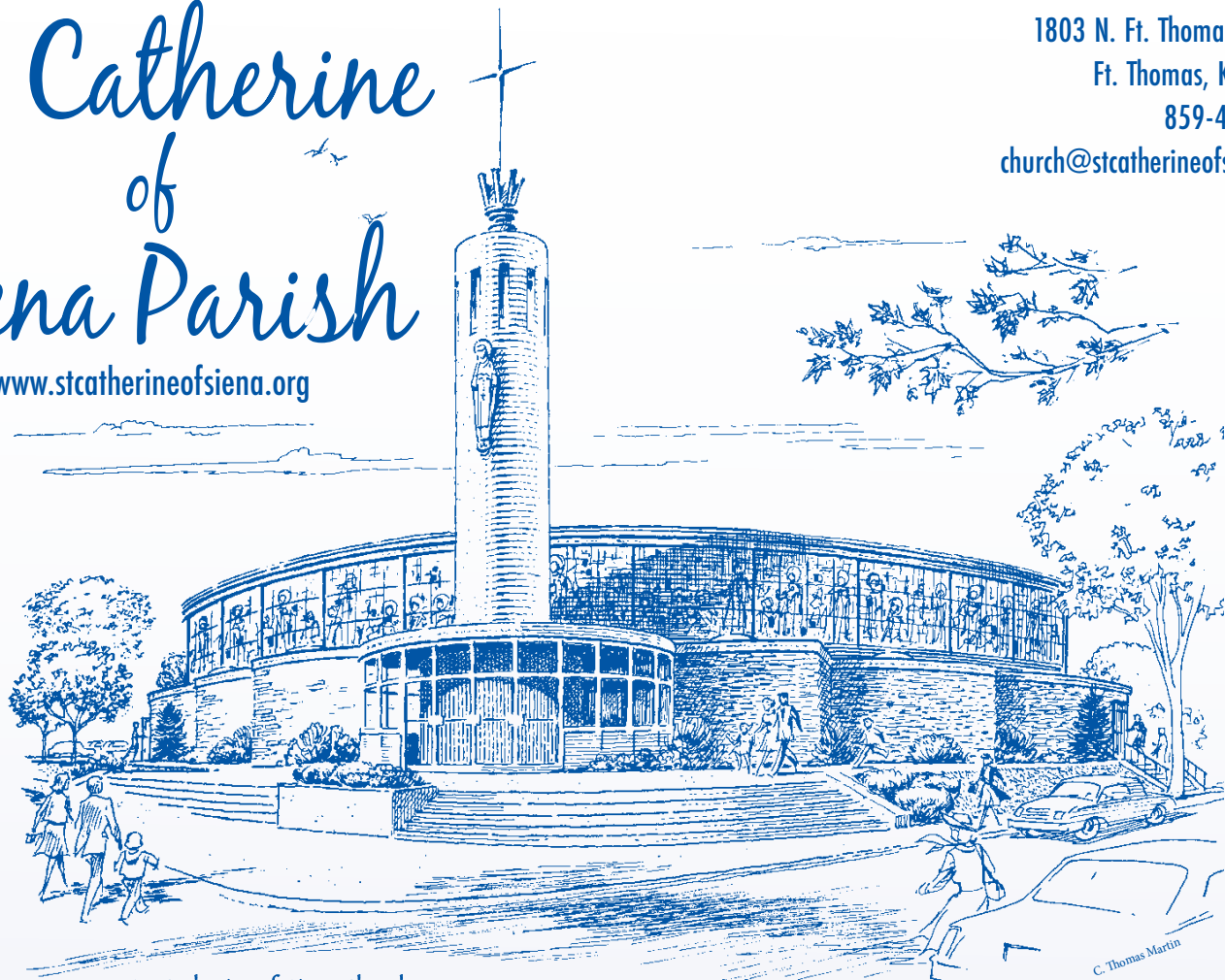

Baptism: Baptism is a joyful event “by which men and women are freed from their sins... are configured to Christ by an indelible character, and are incorporated into the Church.” (Canon 849 of the Code of Canon Law). People can be baptized as adults or infants. The preparation for adult baptism takes place in the process of the catechumenate, commonly known as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, or RCIA. Any adult desiring baptism may call the office to begin this process. Preparation for infant baptism happens in baptism classes, generally held on the fourth Thursday evening of each month in the Parish Office. No child will be baptized at St. Catherine unless both parents have attended one of these classes in the last five years. Baptism of adults generally takes place on Holy Saturday night, while baptism of infants can take place on any Sunday. Since baptism “incorporates one into the Church,” it is appropriate that the infant be baptized during a Sunday liturgy when the local Church is gathered. There are legitimate reasons for not wanting to have the baptism during a Sunday liturgy; in those cases, baptisms may be scheduled for a Sunday at 1:00 p.m.

Parish Membership – Requires an Active Response

Active members of St. Catherine of Siena Parish have registered and provided the Parish Office with the information needed to complete the census forms. Active members regularly participate in the Saturday evening or Sunday Liturgy at St. Catherine of Siena Parish. Active members invest themselves in the parish by participating in the annual Stewardship Program pledging and contributing time, talent and treasure as God calls them. Active members hold the parish in their daily prayers.

SPIRITUAL ADOPTION PROGRAM

Since the passing of *Roe v. Wade* in 1973, according to Live Action’s website, well over 63 million abortions have been performed in the United States. And despite the Supreme Court’s 2022 Dobbs decision that overturned *Roe v. Wade*, there were still over 1 million abortions performed last year.

As a partial answer to this situation, we invite you to “spiritually adopt” a child in the womb. This involves praying each day for a child and its mother, using the prayers in the booklet, “Prayers for a Spiritual Adoption” written by Fr. Stef. The prayers were written for a nine-month period, but this year, we will compress that into nine weeks. You can make these prayers more personal by giving your child an identity and a name. The prayers can be found on the homepage of our website under “Prayers for a Spiritual Adoption” and in the booklets in the back of church.

Each weekend, a new poster from “The Little One Watch Me Grow” series (you will notice that the prayers were adapted from this series) will be on display in the back of church. We hope your family will take part in this “Novena,” learning about how a life develops in a mother’s womb while you are praying for it.
